Foreword

The/Nudge Institute is an action institute working towards a poverty-free India, within our lifetime. We partner with governments, markets, and civil society to build resilient livelihoods for all. The/Nudge Centre for Social Innovation has the mandate to create a thriving livelihoods ecosystem and proactively address barriers and bottlenecks to unlock the systems' potential for large-scale social transformations.

The/Nudge incubator was started in 2017 to make the nonprofit sector aspirational and welcoming for committed and capable entrepreneurs, and to provide the early stage support needed to build high-scale, high-impact nonprofits. In aligning capable founders, large scale problems and disruptive ideas, it fulfilled a deeply felt need in India's nonprofit sector. The/Nudge Accelerator was started in 2019 to nurture growth-stage nonprofit founders to achieve impact at scale. Excluding our current cohorts, we have made innovation grants of Rs. 37 crores (\$4.5 m) to 105 unique organizations.

We would like to thank our funding partners for recognizing the need to support early stage nonprofit entrepreneurs. A big shout out to our Social Entrepreneurship partners for their extreme generosity with their time and bringing their wealth of experience to drive strategic thinking in our entrepreneurs. We are thankful to over 100+ ecosystem supporters who have conducted training sessions and workshops, and shared their learning and experiences with our cohorts.


Sushma Rajgopalan



Incubator Impact Assessment Study

Sattva conducted an impact assessment study for The/Nudge Incubator program from April 2022 to September 2022 to assess the impact of the program on the incubatees and their ability to scale up through replication, speed up problem-solving, and come up with innovative solutions. The study also assessed the larger impact of the incubation program on the start-up ecosystem. The study was conducted over 13 weeks and utilized the OECD's (The organization for Economic Co-operation and Development) Development Assistance Committee (DAC) evaluation framework.

Incubator Impact Assessment Study

While challenges with respect to funds still exist, all stakeholders reported observing a positive mindset shift in the ecosystem. Some key findings are as follows:

- **Structured Support** Sector experts and donors rate The/Nudge Incubator's nonregimented model of support very positively. They found this model to help young start-ups set a solid base for operations at their speed.
- **Trust and Credibility** Stakeholders believed that The/Nudge Incubator is a very well-established name in the sector and the incubatees greatly benefit from it in terms of securing funding
- Attitude Shift Stakeholders reported that the sector has undergone a major shift in the last few years with the attitude towards the nonprofit model warming up. They reported The/Nudge Incubator as being a contributor to shifting this attitude
- **Platform for not-for-profits** Given the few number of incubation programs for not-for-profits, The/Nudge Incubator is filling an important vacuum in terms of providing these organizations a platform to showcase their ideas

Recommendations

- While mentorship is one of the highest-rated aspects of the program, there was a need felt for increased access to the overall mentor network in a manner that incubatees could reach out to any or all of the mentors.
- The program needs to strengthen the alumni outreach aspect of the program. This will enable maintaining a long-lasting relationship with the alumni network. A need to be connected with the alumni was expressed by the incubates as well.
- The study also found a need for graduating incubatees to build strong MEL (Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning) systems and processes with robust data. The report therefore, recommended a greater role for the program in capacity-building founders accordingly.

Thematic Area | Building resilient livelihoods

The vision of a poverty-free India means having a resilient livelihood for all. The pandemic has increased income inequalities and led to a significant income and wealth contraction amongst the marginalized segments in a society that is already splintered along the lines of caste, religion, region, and gender.

The top 30% now holds 90% of India's wealth. India will have 1.04 bn working age people by 2030. India's labour force participation rate (LFPR) fell to 39.5% in FY 2023, with that for women being only 8.8%.

India can only reap its demographic dividend if we are able to skill our workforce, provide inclusive employment opportunities regardless of disability or gender identity or sexual orientation, bring more women into the workforce and increase productivity.

More than half of our alumni are working in areas that are improving resilience in livelihoods for marginalized and underrepresented segments. They are providing access to jobs or increased employability, promoting entrepreneurship, providing skilling opportunities, improving access to knowledge and capital, reducing vulnerability and building capacity.

F4F does that using the payment for ecosystem services (PES) approach for both its deforestation prevention and afforestation programs, providing conditional cash transfers to both farmers and other rural landowners to grow either new forests or protect existing forests. As of 2021–22, India had 265 million school going children with nearly 1.5 million schools, of which 74% are government owned or aided. However as per the 2021 Global Education Monitoring Report, India has the weakest public perception of the Government as the primary provider of school education. This has led to a preference for private schools with those seeking private tuition increasing from 25% in 2018 to 30% in 2022.

As per the 2022 Annual State of Education report, the pandemic has had a deep impact on learning levels, with reading ability sliding to that of 2012, reversing the slow improvement achieved in the intervening years. This poor quality of education is creating an unemployable generation that lacks basic skills & training

The National Education Policy of India 2020 (NEP 2020 is a comprehensive framework for elementary education to higher as well as vocational training in both rural and urban India. The policy aims to transform India's education system by 2030. Non-state actors including philanthropic organizations and NGOs are increasingly part of the ecosystem and influencing all aspects of education including Foundation Learning and Numeracy, Social and Emotional Learning, Career guidance skilling etc. Several of our alumni are working across several aspects of school education and some are helping create systemic change by partnering with State Governments.

Right to Health is an inseparable part of the fundamental Right to Life and Personal Liberty.

Despite having made significant strides in the past 30 years, the inequality of access, active discrimination, and poor quality of healthcare plague India's healthcare system. 75% of all healthcare infrastructure, including medical specialists and doctors, is focused in urban areas, where only 27% of the population resides. Only 65% of children in India receive full immunization during the first year of their life, with unvaccinated children being concentrated in poor and marginalized communities. Women's health continues to be a challenge, in particular menstrual and sexual reproductive health and the unmet need for contraception. Lack of proper nutrition contributes to about 1/3 of the multidimensional poverty in India.



Our alumni are dealing with issues such as getting the marginalized access to medical treatment and immunization. maternal and child nutrition. creating and agency in adolescent girls and mothers. They are harnessing the power technology can plav in addressing issues of access, affordability and quality.
